In 2017, thanks to the support and hard work of donors and volunteers, four shipments of muchneeded material resources were sent to Jordan and Ukraine to bring relief to those affected by war and displacement.

In 2017-18, 4,564 relief kits, 10,800 hygiene kits and 6,330 comforters were sent from Ontario.
